Ithaca College's Department of Education invites applicants for a tenure-eligible Assistant Professor position for a teacher educator with a specialty in second language acquisition and educational psychology to join a collaborative, growing department beginning August 16, 2016. The position involves teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in second language acquisition and literacy development; teaching courses in educational psychology; teaching courses in areas such as methods or field-based seminars appropriate for the candidate's expertise and the department's needs ; conducting and publishing research; and participating in service to the department, campus, community, and profession. We seek a creative colleague with a deep commitment to diversity, equity, and innovative practice in education, consistent with our department's mission.

Required qualifications: Teacher education experience; experience addressing issues of diversity and equity in education; experience in the areas of second language acquisition and literacy development; experience in the area of educational psychology; a record of (or clear potential for) scholarly activity; at least three years of K-12 teaching experience; a record of collaborative activity; and excellent written and oral communication skills. Preferred: Experience in secondary education; experience supervising field experiences. Preference will be given to candidates with an earned doctorate by time of appointment in education, curriculum and instruction, or a related field. However, ABD candidates who have made significant progress towards completion of the degree are also encouraged to apply.
